

THURSDAY






The whole day was going really well, we took a bus to Frýdek Místek where the firefighters with four fully prepared stations were waiting for us to arrive.

They heard everything from two educated dispatchers. Some of them had the opportunity to try a simulation of a real call.

After this wonderful occasion, everyone went to have lunch and go bowling which everyone really enjoyed. At the end of the day, everyone came back to Frýdlant to enjoy some free time with their host families.


